Dear Reception and Nursery Parents, here is our topic for this half term. Please use it to aid your own research or bring things into class to support our learning. Have fun!





As communicators we will:

Learn new vocabulary related to the summer season, seaside exploration and pirates! We will learn new words from our story books related to pirates and the seaside and express our ideas effectively to our peers and teachers.

As readers and writers we will:

Read: 'Pirate Pete by Kim Kennedy, Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister, Grandpa Granda-a read together book and The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch.

Writing: Reception pupils will aim to write sentences independently which include capital letters, fingerspaces, some correctly spelt words and fullstops! Nursery pupils will aim to write their names and engage in mark making, ascribing meaning to their marks.



As mathematicians we will:

Explore sorting with shells, sea creatures and seaside objects. Learn to recognise numbers and match them correctly to groups of objects. We will explore the properties of 2D and 3D shapes describing their sides, corners, faces and names.

Reception pupils will apply their understanding of numbers to solve problems which involve sharing, halving, doubling and counting in groups of 2s, 5s and 10s.

As individuals and friends we will:

Learn how to play collaboratively

As artists, actors and musicians:

We will create seaside collages using a variety of different materials. Create 3D seaside collage pictures, exploring and mixing different colour paints. Learn songs about pirates, sea creatures and the seaside. Engage in imaginative play related to pirates!



As healthy movers we will:

Learn about the importance of diet, sun safety and personal hygiene in keeping well. In movement lessons we will practise moving in different ways, learning how to hop, skip and jump in time to music.
