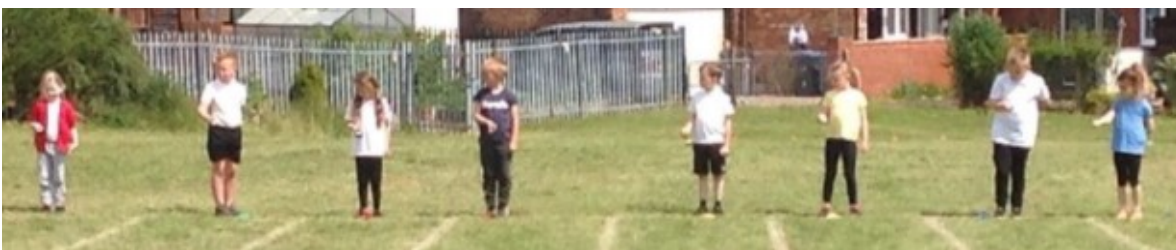

Please do not send your child to school wearing any jewellery. Children may wear a watch but one that tells the time only. If children have long hair, it should be tied back.

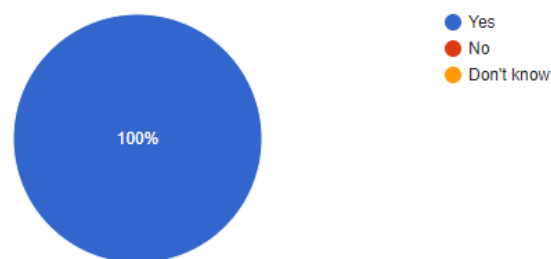
Car park repairs
